



Thomas Halpin Cobb

January 25, 1956 - March 1, 2022

Thomas (Tom) Halpin Cobb, age 66, passed away on Tuesday, March 1, 2022 in the home he shared with friends in Orlando, Florida. Tom was born on January 25, 1956 in Glen Cove, New York. He was the second of four siblings. He grew up in Brooklyn and Mt. Vernon, NY, Annapolis, MD, and Hollywood, FL. In 1992, Tom moved to the Central Florida area to be near his friends and family.

Tom was a 1974 graduate of Nova High School in Davie, FL and attended Brevard Community College in Cocoa Beach. Over the course of his lifetime, Tom worked in sales, marketing, and customer service. His latest position was with Orlando Auto Auctions. Tom retired in 2020.

Tom was preceded in death by his brother Raymond Bruce Cobb, Jr, his mother Elizabeth Gibson Morin, and his father Raymond Bruce Cobb, Sr. He is survived by his sister Clara Cobb in Orlando, his sister Jean Cobb Smith in Gainesville, his niece Micaela Dionisi Navarra, his nephew Brian Dionisi in Los Angeles, and his great-niece and nephew Gabriella and Antonio.

Tom had a youthful spirit all his life. He was kindhearted, easygoing, and beloved by his friends and family. He enjoyed helping people. He was a dedicated animal lover, especially of parrots and dogs, which were his companions for many years.

Tom was a maverick surfer in his youth, winning the East Coast Surfing Championship in 1975. He was also a hard worker, and earned Coca Cola of Miami's Salesman and Employee of the Year award in 1986.

Tom was an avid fisherman since childhood. He loved taking long walks, cycling, the beach, and Central Florida's lakes, where he could admire the natural beauty of the area. He was also a U.S. history buff, enthusiastic rock and roll fan, and adventure film aficionado.


Tom's cremains will be interred next to his brother Bruce (Ray) Cobb in Mount Peace Cemetery in St. Cloud, FL. His family plans to hold a Celebration of Life for him at a later date, to share their memories of him. He will be greatly missed.
